1. Alphabet. Transliteration

A a [a], B b [б], C c [ц], Ch [ч], D d [д], E e [э], F f [ф], G g [г],
H h [х], I i [и], J j [й, ъ], K k [к], L l [л], M m [м], N n [н], O o
[o], P p [п], R r [р], S s [с], Sh [ш], T t [т], U u [у], V v [в], Z z
[з], Zh [ж]

2. The stress always falls on the first syllable

3. The word class endings

Adjective	-o
Verb	-i
Adverb	-e
Numeral	-u

4. Plural indicator of nouns - **da**, adjectives can only in some cases take the plural form:

nejdandi	your daughter

pojbandi	your boy
pojbandansi	their boy

B) Genitive from the noun with more than one instance

nejdadam	my daughters
nejdadad	your daughters
nejdadas	his, her daughters
pojkadangam	my boys
pojkadangad	your boys
pojkadangas	their boys

nejdadanmi	our daughters

nejdadansi	their daughters
pojkadanganmi	our boys
pojkadangandi	your boys
